## Supporting you while you wait for assessment

While you are waiting for your Right to Choose ADHD or Autism assessment there are a range of services you can access for support.

### Adults

Autism Hampshire also has a network of [community hubs for adults](#) across Hampshire and the Isle of Wight. These hubs will provide welcoming local spaces where autistic and/or ADHD adults can access face-to-face information, advice and guidance, connect with support, and learn about services available in their communities.

The hubs are designed for autistic and/or ADHD adults, including those who may be exploring neurodivergence or waiting for diagnosis.

At the hubs, people can:

- access trusted information and advice
- learn about local support and services
- connect with others in the community
- find out about the Autism and ADHD Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG) service

You do not need a diagnosis to attend.

- Increase everyone's knowledge and understanding of neurodivergence.
- Promote a healthy home and school environment and improve family dynamics

The Southampton Neurodiversity Multidisciplinary Team aims to increase everyone's knowledge and understanding of neurodivergence.

- Supporting early stages of the new ND pathway
- Therapeutic support and guidance for ND children and young people.
- Capturing the voices of children and young people to help shape the new ND pathway.
- Parent Carer support. Coordinated by the Parent Carer Forum. Supported by Parent Carer groups across the city.

- Provide 1:1 support and signposting
- Run SEND get-togethers and workshops
- Reduce isolation for parent carers
- Gather parent voice through surveys and conversations

Sensory Supports is an online resource designed to support schools and families with practical, inclusive sensory strategies that promote the wellbeing and regulation of all children - whether neurodivergent or neurotypical.

We believe sensory needs are universal, and our approach is grounded in the understanding that every child benefits from environments that respect and respond to their sensory experiences.
